TAC Club Participation Program is for all Basketball Victoria associations and clubs to actively participate in the mission to promote safe travel on our roads.

One death on our roads is too many, and we need you to **BE THE DIFFERENCE**.

We're asking associations and clubs of all sizes to encourage their members to help build a culture of road safety.

The TAC Club Participation Program includes three key criteria to get involved, and we will reward associations and clubs who show their efforts to promote road safety.

ROAD SAFETY FOCUS

The priority road safety focus for this basketball season is speeding.

Each year in Victoria, speeding contributes to at least 30% of fatal crashes and 25% of serious injury crashes.

Going "a little bit over" the speed limit, by as little as 5 km/h, increases the risk of a serious crash by 44%.

BE THE DIFFERENCE Make the right choice. Slow down on the road.

Because individual actions don't just protect you. They protect your team. They protect Victorians.

By getting involved via these quick steps, we are rewarding clubs with a share in a total prize pool of \$30,000.

 - Screenshots or links of social media posts, content or any other digital activity
 - Copies of promotions, written material and collateral
- Submit your final application by midnight on Tuesday 31 March 2026
- Wait for announcement from Basketball Victoria in May 2026

HOW YOUR CLUB CAN BE THE DIFFERENCE.

Every application will be assessed by members of a panel made up of key road safety and community experts from the TAC and Basketball Victoria.

Applications will be marked and measured against the **three key criteria** outlined on pages 6-8.

GET YOUR CLUB AND COMMUNITY INVOLVED

BE THE DIFFERENCE by signing up, spreading the word, and promoting road safety.

- Register your club via SmartyGrants
 (QR code on page 5) and start
 your application, to receive updates
 throughout the season.
- Start the conversation and discuss plans to champion road safety at a Club Committee meeting.
- Encourage a few club members to be road safety champions, to help boost participation.
- Post on your club social media to announce your involvement in the program and tag us at @TACVictoria #TACBeTheDifference.
- Use TAC resources and merchandise to raise awareness of road safety messages, and the risks of speeding a few kms/h over the limit, around your club.

 Get creative by developing other tailored content and initiatives that involve your players and members, including:

- Print the 'Slo-Mo How To' guide from the TAC digital assets and share around your club.
- Encourage slow-motion video capture of training drills, game day actions, trick shots or other basketball moments.

PARTICIPATE IN ROAD SAFETY ROUND

TAC Road Safety Round is the inaugural Victoria community basketball themed round that will take place 19 January – 1 February 2026.

Road Safety Round aims for grassroots and elite clubs to 'Band Together' to raise awareness of road safety throughout Victoria. By getting involved, your club will join a community movement to encourage Victorians to be safer on our roads.

During the Road Safety Round, we ask your club to show us how you banded together, to help support your TAC Club Participation Program application.

Here are some ways that you can actively promote and participate in the 2026 TAC Basketball Victoria Road Safety Round:

- Encourage all players and staff (including volunteers) to wear the provided armbands to encourage your community to 'Band Together' for road safety.
- Host a themed Road Safety Round between 19 January – 1 February 2026.
- Join the community by sharing content on social media using the tags #TACBandTogether and @TACVictoria and @BasketballVictoria.
- Use other Road Safety Round assets across the round (Scan the QR code on page 6 to download).
- Promote Road Safety Round in club newsletters, website and digital platforms.

- Invite local media to feature the club's Road Safety Round activity. This could be a photo moment or interviewing a club community member who has a lived experience with road trauma (if appropriate).
- Create stadium signage, court signs, placards and additional collateral to promote Road Safety Round.
- Invite a member of club committee to speak on the importance of the club participating in round at a club dinner/event.
- Involve local Victoria Police, Victoria SES or your Local Council representatives in activities, such as speaking to playing groups or participating in events.

THREE

SHARE THE ROAD SAFETY SURVEY

Help us learn more about road safety attitudes, behaviours and challenges across Victoria. Getting association or club members involved helps us improve our campaigns year on year.

Share the road safety survey via your club communication channels: social media, group chats, website, QR code at club dinners.

- Encourage your community to complete the survey during March 2026.
 - Survey links will be made available at a later date.
- Capture evidence of your association or club promoting the survey to further support your application.

ADDITIONAL TIPS

IMPROVE YOUR APPLICATION

There are plenty of other ways to showcase engagement and your teams commitment to safe travel on our roads.

Examples include:

- Capture peer-to-peer videos delivered by players for social media.
- Set up a 'Be the Difference' player of the week, team motto or photo wall for your club to contribute to.
- Interview club members about their experiences.
- Host a themed event, information session or guest speaker at the club.
- Create signage at your stadium to encourage drivers to slow down.
- Include a road safety tip of the week in club newsletters, match programs or social media posts.
- Launch club initiatives such as designated driver buses for events or offer discounted soft drinks for designated drivers.

And finally...

We encourage your association or club to promote additional road safety messages that are also relevant to your community — whether that's around drink driving, distractions, seatbelt use, or looking out for others on the road.
